RESIDENT COMMENT

Councilman Kane said he attended a meeting in Syracuse regarding solar farming. He said in Summerset and Clayton, there were no local laws on the books regarding windmills and solar farming; so as a result, the Governor set up a 5-man board. Mr. Kane said they have the power on solar farming and wind mills. Councilman Kane said because there were no ordinances on the books, those towns had no control.

He said in Summerset and Clayton, the SEQR goes to the Board that the Governor appointed. Councilman Kane said a six-month moratorium is a good thing, because that gives the Town time to investigate the pros and cons of both solar farming and wind mills.
