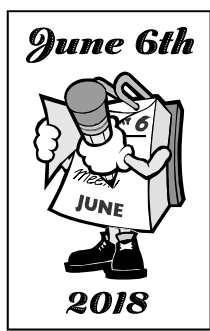

# Planning Board ★★★★★★★★★★

Chairwoman Donna Salamone called the meeting to order at 6:05 PM in the Board Room at the Schuyler Town Office, 2090 State Route 5, Utica, NY 13502.

Other Planning Board members present were Vice Chair David Fusillo, James Digristina, Jean Finster, Daniel Tripoli, and Alternate Member Dale Dodge, who was seated. Absent were Victor Costanza and Michael Ritter.

Other Town officials present were Supervisor Anthony J. Lucenti, Administrative Assistant to the Supervisor Jeff Dingman, Codes Officer Philip Green and Bette Szesny who serves as recording secretary.

Also present was Town resident Richard Finster.

### MINUTES

Motion by David Fusillo, seconded by Jean Finster to approve the minutes of the May, 2018 meeting as presented; all in favor. Motion carried.

### DISCUSSION: ZONING MAP UPDATE

Codes Officer Philip Green stated the new owner of Mohawk Valley GIS hasn't started work on the Little Falls project, so he is not able to provide any input on this company; however, he stated the previous owner had completed a good part of the mapping; therefore it could easily be updated rather than starting with a new company. The Planning Board will therefore hold up on retaining the services of any concern, pending receipt of further input from Mr. Green.

### TOWN MASTER PLAN UPDATE

Supervisor Anthony J. Lucenti reported he came across a copy of the Town's Comprehensive Plan that was completed in 2007 by the late Dave Carlson, a grant writer whose services were retained by the Town Board to assist with the Farm Grant. He then conferred with Kristin Campbell, HOCPP (County Planning), who advised this study can most likely serve as the Town's new master plan, with just a few updates. This process will require the SEQR process, with the Planning Board serving as Lead Agency. However, most involved agencies will merely include other Town Departments, streamlining the process to a minimum. The updated master plan will also need to be referred to HOCPP for their recommendation.

Ms. Salamone stated in light of this new information, there will be no need to form subcommittees among the Planning Board members.

### ANIMAL CONTROL LAW

Supervisor Lucenti presented an updated version of the Town's current "Animal Control Law," which has served as the Town's "Leash Law" since 1992. This update was prepared by the Town's attorney. The new version addresses control of additional animal species such as farm animals and the like. A discussion ensued among the Planning Board members, Mr. Green and Supervisor Lucenti, and it was ultimately decided to not combine the leash law with a law that controls wandering farm animals infringing on neighbors' properties. The current leash law will remain intact; a separate law will be underwritten to address control of other animal species, with violations to be handled by the codes officer, and specific fines set for first and repeated violations. Supervisor Lucenti will refer the

proposed law back to the Town's attorney and request the aforementioned changes to be undertaken. The Planning Board will resume discussion and action on this matter at the August meeting.

### GRANT WRITER / GRANT FUNDING

Supervisor Lucenti reported the Town Board has engaged the services of grant writer Jeremy Silverman, GEMS, to assist in obtaining grant funding for required maintenance to the Town's sewer system. As well, the services of G&G Consultants has been engaged to undertake an Income Survey of the residents in the Sewer District, which will be submitted to funding agencies in the hope of obtaining a grant that will offset or possibly eliminate costs of the required maintenance and/or repairs to be borne by the residents of the Town's Sewer District. If the median income level of residents in the Sewer District falls below \$45,000/year, there is a good chance funding will be granted. This survey will be undertaken in July, and will be completed by the end of that month.

Supervisor Lucenti also stated the Community Foundation is another possible source for grant funding for this and other projects undertaken by the Town of Schuyler.

### CANAL BIKE TRAIL

Supervisor Lucenti reported he attended a recent meeting held at the N. Utica Senior Citizens Center, and provided the Planning Board with a report on the Canal Corp's plans for development of the new portion of the trail that will go through Schuyler at Dyke Road, connecting the trail from Utica to Frankfort and on to Ilion.

### PROPOSED SOLAR FARM

Supervisor Lucenti reported an application is anticipated to be submitted in 2019 for a 300 acre solar farm, 150 acres to be sited in the eastern section of Town that will extend another 150 acres into the Town of Herkimer. The project will be overseen by NYSERDA.

### UPCOMING PRESENTATION BY RENEWABLE ENERGY FIRM

Supervisor Lucenti reported the Town Board will receive a presentation by Mike Beckner of Sun-East Development at their June 13th meeting. Mr. Beckner will be proposing a grant opportunity for the Town of Schuyler involving installation of a hybrid auto recharging station for an in-kind contribution of \$4,000, which, as an example, could involve construction of a small patch of pavement for the charging station. A discussion ensued with regard to the need for this commodity in an area where few people would likely be stopping to use the facility. It was noted most long-distance travelers passing through Schuyler do not travel in hybrid vehicles. Mr. Dingman stated he owns a cross-over vehicle (gas and renewable energy dependent), and he, like many others, utilizes the charging station at the Price Chopper Plaza in North Utica, whenever it becomes necessary to recharge his vehicle.

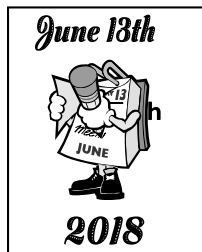
### ADJOURNMENT

## Town Board ★★★★★★

**COUNCIL MEMBERS PRESENT:** Supervisor Anthony Lucenti, Councilwoman Bette Szesny, Councilmen Rodney Dodge, Joseph Juliano, and Eric Kane.

**ALSO PRESENT WERE:** Town Clerk Barbara J. Boulia, Acting Highway Superintendent Philip Johnson, Assessor George Haskell, Codes Enforcement Officer Philip Green, and Park Ranger Joe Boulia. Also present were Frances & Russ Holzberger, Clarence H. Cadwell, Jeffery Dingman, Brian D'Aprix, Peter Cardone, Jr., John Werczynski, JoAnn Mammone and Dale Dodge.

Supervisor Anthony Lucenti led the assembled people in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

**PAY BILLS:** Motion by Szesny, second by Kane that the bills for the past month be paid as presented: General, #163 — #208, and Highway, #112 — #123; all in favor.

**MINUTES OF MAY 9, 2018:** Motion by Juliano, second by Szesny, that the Town Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of May 9, 2018; all in favor.

**PRESENTATION — BY APEX SOLAR CHARGING STATIONS:** Supervisor Lucenti said Taylor & Tom from Apex Solar charging stations would like to speak to the Town Board. Taylor said Apex is a solar car charging system, and they would like to put a system in Schuyler. He said there is a \$250,000.00 grant available thru DEC, and they will help the Town with the paperwork. He said there is a 20% charge to the Town for incline, which would consist of digging trenches, a concrete pad, etc.

**RESIDENT COMMENT:** Town resident Frances Holzberger said there are several properties on Mapleton Drive where lawns need to be mowed; the grass is over ten inches high. Codes Enforcement Officer Philip Green said he has already advised the owners in writing that they have 14 days to mow; if they do not do it, the Town of Schuyler will hire someone to mow and it will go on the tax rolls. He said he already has the names on the contractor's list.

**ASSESSOR REPORT — BY GEORGE HASKELL:** Assessor George Haskell said our new equalization rate is 88.4 %, instead of 90%.

**CODES REPORT — BY PHILIP GREEN:** Town resident Brian D'Aprix, said he has a problem with animal control. Codes Enforcement Officer Philip Green said they are currently working on a new Local Law.

Mr. Green said he will stop at Bull Road and look into the situation.

**COUNTY LEGISLATOR'S REPORT:** Not available.

**SUPERVISOR'S REPORT:** Supervisor Lucenti said he spoke with George Dunbar from the V.F.W., and he said Mr. Dunbar has been receiving phone calls for the Schuyler Volunteer Fire Department. He said if anyone has a question for the Fire Department to contact the 911 call center.

Supervisor Lucenti said he has been receiving calls from residents regarding 4-wheelers, side by sides, and dirt bikes. He said there was almost a head-on collision last week. He said he asked Barb to send a letter to the N.Y.S. Police regarding coverage in our area, and she sent a certified registered letter to them. He said they will be patrolling our area.

**SEWER PROJECT:** Supervisor Lucenti said we have a small area of 15,000 feet, which stops at Mr. Mc Gills. He said there are approximately 300 to 500 customers, at a cost of \$461,000.00 (for rehabilitation). He said the Town Board last month retained a grant writer to offset the cost of the sewer repairs. He said according to the 2010 Census, the average income of the residents is \$50,400.00 per household. He suggested hiring G & G Municipal Consulting Firm to get an accurate figure of the household income in the Sewer District. He said G & G will send out letters regarding this, and if there is no response by mail, they will be making stops at the households who did not respond. He said they need a majority (of responses).

Motion by Dodge, second by Szesny to hire GEMS, Jeremy Silverman to prepare a Grant for Consolidated Funding in the amount of \$6,800.00, and also a Grant for USDA for \$2,125.00; all in favor.

Motion by Dodge, second by Juliano to hire G & G Consulting Firm to do the income survey in the amount of \$6,975.00, based on 450 households; if less than 450, it will be reduced.

There will be an informational meeting on July 5, 2018 at 6:00 P.M. and also on July 10, 2018 at 6:00 P.M., for any questions regarding the sewer. A Public hearing will be on July 11, 2018 at 5:45 P.M. regarding the sewer project.

Motion by Dodge, second by Juliano to have a Public Hearing on July 11, 2018 at 5:45 P.M. for the Consolidated Grant Funding Project; all in favor.

**PARK BENCHES:** Supervisor Lucenti said he received an estimate of \$7,000.00 to replace the park benches that were stolen from Wood Lane. Councilman Juliano suggested checking into composite board, or something less expensive.



**DOLLAR GENERAL:** Supervisor Lucenti said he received word that the Dollar General will be located on State Route 5, Utica, NY. He said they will be submitting an application next week.

**2007 STRATEGIC PLAN:** Supervisor Lucenti said the Town of Schuyler's last Strategic Plan was dated 1965. He said he found a copy of the 2007 (Strategic) Plan that Dave Carlson did. He said that Plan was never submitted, and he would like to hire Jeff Dingman to update it for submission.

**SOLAR PROJECT:** Supervisor Lucenti said he received a letter from SunEast Development LLC after he met with them. He said this is a ground-mounted Solar Photovoltaic array project SunEast is proposing on the property of Carolyn Goodhines, located near Watkins Road in the Town of Schuyler.

**JUDGES ANNUAL TRAINING SESSION & COURT CLERKS:** Supervisor Lucenti said he received a letter from the two Judges regarding their yearly training, to attend training. It is to be held in Buffalo, New York, and for the Court Clerks, in Lake Placid, September 16th thru September 19, 2018.

Motion by Kane, second by Szesny authorizing the Judges & Court Clerks to attend training; Judges: September 23rd thru September 26, 2018, and Clerks: September 16th thru 19th, 2018; all in favor.

**THANK YOU TO MIKE DE ZOTELL:** Supervisor Lucenti said he would like to thank Mike De Zotell for the music he played for the Ride for Missing Children on June 1st, 2018.

**HIGHWAY REPORT — BY ACTING SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS:** Acting Superintendent Johnson said regarding the Security Cameras, he has not done anything as of yet.

He said they have been working on Sky View and Bull Roads. He said he has received an estimate to do Dodge Lane, Oak Hill Road, Sky View for \$37,000.00; and for Bull Road — estimate is \$21,000.00.

Acting Superintendent of Highways Johnson said they have been working on Wood Lane, and they ordered a new backboard. He said the Ford 550 has been ordered.

Supervisor Lucenti read a letter from Mr. Snyder, regarding the shoulders on Wood Lane that need to be graded. Mr. Snyder said they are a hazard to people, especially at Extravaganza time. Acting Supervisor Johnson said he will take care of it.

**RECREATION — BY JOE JULIANO:** Councilman Juliano said Detweiler Construction will finish up the new building for \$2,850.00. He said that will be done next week. He said he purchased signs and gave them to Joe Boulia, and kept two for Wood Lane. Joe Boulia said signs are up at the Park and cameras are in.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Town of Schuyler will submit a funding application to the New York State Office of Homes and Community Renewal through the Consolidated Funding Application (CFA) process on or about July 27, 2018, in an amount not to exceed \$750,000 under the Community Development Block Grant Public Infrastructure Program.
