RESIDENT COMMENT

✓ **Town Resident Joe Serbaniewicz** said he would like to thank the town for the Flags that were put up for Memorial Day.

Councilman Anthony Lucenti said he thinks part of the plan with the consolidation of municipal governments, is they will be able to buy flags by the gross which will save money on the flags for the cemetery for both Veterans and Firemen.

Mr. Serbaniewicz said he is here because he attended the Asphalt Hearing on the Riccelli Asphalt Plant. He was concerned that the Asphalt Plant would be using Windfall and Newport Roads. He said he had concerns about the usage of the roads, air quality, and water contamination. He was advised that the following studies were done; SEQR, Dept. of Transportation, Environmental Protection Agency, and Department of Environmental Conservation and everything is fine.

✓ **Town Resident Gary Sroka** said he is concerned about Windfall Road. Codes Enforcement Officer Phil Green said he believes the most feasible route would be State Route 28.

Mr. Green also said the roads are rated for weight load.

Councilman Anthony Lucenti said he is going to make a trip to Waterloo to check out the Riccelli plant.

Councilman Kane said if anyone did not know about the plant out there, they would not even surmise it was there. He said it is next to the Thruway were the mall is. He said it is Exit 41. He said he encourages anyone who wants to take a ride out there to do so.

Mr. Kane said he went to the new location with a compass and checked wind conditions. He said the East wind would be in the area of the Ricci Farm, and the West wind would be towards Frankfort. He said Alyssa Circle should have no odor.

✓ **Garden Homes manager Rich Arcuri** said they own three mobile home parks in the Town of Schuyler. Mr. Arcuri said "Screams Along the Canal" across the road from one park is having huge parties with alcohol and other stuff. He said the New York State Troopers have been called there several times, and he wants to know if something can be done. He said they are parking cars at the mobile home park and making a lot of noise until the early morning hours.

Codes Enforcement Officer Philip Green said he has been in contact with the State Troopers regarding the holding of concerts, and he said he has the Town Attorney involved also. He said the Town does not have a police department, and the only thing he can do is have the Attorney involved and write the proper ticket. He said as for the State Troopers, he believes they



are under-manned, especially on the weekend.

Mr. Arcuri also said he is concerned about the quality of water, due to Riccelli. He was advised there was no problem with that, due to SEQR. After the meeting, he gave the Town Clerk a petition signed by the Mobile Home Park regarding "Screams Along the Canal."

✓ **Garden Homes resident Tony Torino** said he previously was a police officer. He said the noise coming from "Screams Along the Canal" is very bad. He said they have fireworks, park all over the mobile home park, and sometimes there are fights. He said something has to be done regarding this.
