MINUTES — SEPTEMBER 14th, 21st & OCTOBER 4, 2016: Motion by Szesny, second by VanDusen, that the Town Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of September 14th, 21st, and October 4, 2016 and approve them as printed; all in favor.

PAY BILLS: Motion by Kane, second by Szesny, that the bills for the past month be paid as presented General #365 to #414 and Highway #154 to #168; all in favor.

RESIDENT COMMENT: Town Resident Tom Tripoli said he has a question: "What is the ZBA?" Councilman VanDusen said the ZBA is the Zoning Board of Appeals. He said he has a question regarding set backs and where to put up a fence. Councilman VanDusen said 25 feet is for set back, if anything less then you have to go to the Zoning Board of Appeals. Mr. Tripoli asked if a fence can be set on the property line and what kind of fence. Codes Enforcement Officer Philip Green said you can set it right on the line, and it has to be a nice looking fence, no barb wire.

AYSO Representative Tanya Macrina said she spoke to Joe, and he advised her to come to the Town Board Meeting. Tanya said she has a check in the amount of \$400.00, which is a donation from AYSO for use of the field last year and this year. Supervisor Dodge said they appreciate the generous donation.

NOISE ORDINANCE — LETTER FROM TOWN ATTORNEY: Supervisor Kenneth M. Dodge read a letter from the Town Attorney regarding the Noise Ordinance. He said, "As as the Town relies upon the Sheriff's Dept., due to not having its own Police Dept., and the Sheriff's Dept. not having road patrols, police coverage is done by the NYS. Troopers. Accordingly, the enforcement of local laws is at the whim of the dispatcher for the State Troopers. The State Troopers must enforce State laws, but may decline to enforce local laws, especially something with a low priority for them as a noise ordinance." There being no further business to come before the Town Board the meeting was adjourned at 6:45 P.M.
